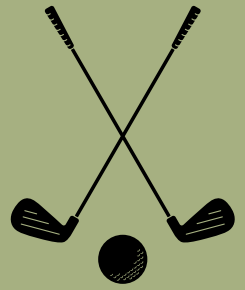

GOLF RESPONSIBILITIES



1. Be respectful and friendly to others (Members, Guests, and Staff)

- No loud music, excessive drinking, or loud boisterous behavior.
- Be considerate while others are putting – don't talk, don't step in someone's line, stay out of their line of sight, and be mindful of your shadow's location, excess clubs, and flag.
- Only utilize designated bathroom facilities (not the course).
- If driving past golf holes, be sure not to pass while others are actively hitting a ball or putting on the green.

2. Keep the course beautiful

- Repair divots on the tee box and fairway – remember to bring a sand bottle with you when you walk to your ball and do not have easy access to a cart's sand bottles.
- Repair all ball marks you see on the green.
- Rake, enter, and exit bunkers properly (low side), tap sand off shoes, and replace rakes on the grass edge of the bunker away from the green.
- Follow proper cart procedures – 90-degree rule, all 4 wheels on the cart path at tee boxes and near greens.
- Be sure to obey all cart signs and do not drive on the fairway within 75 yards of green, between green and white stakes, or on any par 3s.
- Pickup your trash – cigarette and cigar butts, broken tees, and food wrappers.

3. Follow proper pre-play and check-in procedures

- All players' names should be listed on the tee sheet the day before your tee time (there should be no TBD on the current day's tee sheet).
- Dress according to the published golf dress code.
- Non-Members need to register and check in at the Pro Shop.
- All players should check in with the starter before play.

4. Pace of play considerations

- Play within 4 hours.
- Keep up with the group ahead of you.
- Be helpful to others – help watch, find their ball if you know your ball location, and offer to fill divot or rake if needed.
- Play ready golf when feasible and be prepared to hit when it is your turn – walk to your ball, take a couple of clubs, range finder, and plan your shot while your cart mate hits their ball.
- Keep your pre-shot routine short – one practice swing. From club selection to execution should be under 20 seconds.
